Why are residents of some ZIP codes healthier than others?

For example, in the north Sacramento neighborhood of Del Paso Heights, the infant mortality rate is the highest in Sacramento County, with a rate of 6.73 deaths per 1.000 less hatths.

But explaining the disparity from ZIP code to ZIP code requires a careful examination of several

factors, according to Olivia Kasirye, public health officer for the Sacramento County Department of health and Human Services. Antong the factors the Healthy Sacramento Coalition is tooking at within each area are the social and economic makeup, access and quality of care, environmental quality and education. It's a complicated issue, but Kasirye says the best strategy toward a sofution is to have the community come together to solve it.

She adds that the Healthy Sacramento Coalition is focused on making changes that will have a larger impact in the long term, such as an increase in the number of people who have access to fresh foods. Bringing farmers markets to these neighborhoods, or encouraging people to grow their own fresh foods in a personal garden are just a couple of the ways the coalition is tackling the issue.

"Looking at the data gives us an idea of some of the factors we are facing, but each organization brings a different perspective," Kasinye says. "Some are looking at policies, some are focused on education and some are focused on access. It's not an easy answer; and no one organization is going to have all of the answers."


Can your ZIP code determine your health?
